ORGANIZATIONAL CHAR

THE PURPOSES OF THE SOCIETY ARE:

(A) TO LEAD A RECONCILIATION EFFORT BY AN INDIGENOUS AND ELDER-LED GROUP OR COLLECTIVE COMPRISED OF INDEPENDENT CONTRACTORS AND HELPERS TO OFFER PROGRAMS AND SERVICES IN A TRAUMA INFORMED WAY, WHICH GROUP OR COLLECTIVE IS COMMITTED TO DECOLONIZING MENTAL HEALTH AND ADDICTION SERVICES TO INDIGENOUS PERSONS, FIRST NATIONS, METIS AND "ALL STATUS OR NON-STATUS COMMUNITY MEMBERS BY WEAVING IN CULTURE, MINDFULNESS AND SPIRITUALITY, ALL OF WHICH BEING CONSIDERED TO BE A RELEVANT PART OF PERSONAL WELLNESS FOR SUCH INDIVIDUALS, WHILE, AT THE SAME TIME, STRIVING TO BE INCLUSIVE OF ALL CREEDS, COLOURS AND FAITHS IN THE SPIRIT OF RESPECTFUL UNDERSTANDING AND INCLUSIVITY, BEING PROUDLY SUPPORTIVE OF ALL PEOPLE BOTH INSIDE AND OUTSIDE OF THE LGBTQ2S+ (QUEER) UMBRELLA AND ALL INDIVIDUALS HEALING FROM SUBSTANCE ABUSE CONCERNS, WITH A SPECIAL FOCUS ON PERSONS LOCATED ON ISOLATED AND UNDERSERVED REMOTE AREAS; AND

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(B) TO RECEIVE GIFTS, BEQUESTS, FUNDS AND PROPERTY, AND TO HOLD, INVEST, ADMINISTER AND DISTRIBUTE FUNDS AND PROPERTY TO SUCH OTHER ORGANIZATIONS AS ARE "QUALIFIED DONEES" UNDER THE PROVISION OF THE INCOME TAX ACT (CANADA) WHICH ENGAGE AN INDIGENOUS AND ELDER-LED GROUP OR COLLECTIVE COMPRISED OF INDEPENDENT CONTRACTORS AND HELPERS TO PROVIDE INDIGENOUS-LED

PROGRAMS AND SERVICES IN BRITISH COLUMBIA AND ELSEWHERE IN CANADA, WHICH GROUP OR COLLECTIVE BEING COMPRISED OF A LARGE AND HIGHLY DIVERSE NETWORK OF WISDOM KEEPERS, CONTRACTED CLINICAL COUNSELLORS, SOCIAL WORKERS, STUDENTS AND GROUP FACILITATORS WHO WORK TOGETHER IN COLLABORATION TO PROVIDE DYNAMIC HOLISTIC HEALTH AND WELLNESS PROGRAMS AND SERVICES TO THE INDIVIDUALS DESCRIBED IN PARAGRAPH (A) OF THIS CONSTITUTION WHO ARE HEALING

FROM SUBSTANCE ABUSE CONCERNS, WITH PARTICULAR ATTENTION TO ACCESS AND DELIVERY OF PROGRAMS AND SERVICES TO PERSONS LOCATED ON ISOLATED AND UNDER-SERVED REMOTE AREAS.
